This course walks through the earlier stages of the history and evolution of English Literature. It traces the development of English literary language, literary style, and poetic forms. It attends to early English expressions of the epic and heroic, the comic and satirical, the elegiac, the romantic, the tragic, and the mystical.

Beowulf The Dream of the Rood Sir Gawain and the Green Knight Chaucer: The Wife of Bath's Prologue and Tale Julian of Norwich: selections from A Book of Showings The Second Shepherds' Play The English Bible (I Corinthians 13) Sonnets, especially Shakespeare Lyrics: Donne, Johnson, Herbert, Herrick, Philips, Marvell Milton: selections from Paradise Lost Swift: selections from Gulliver's Travels

Other: This course will be classroom based but with hybrid functions through recorded lectures and Zoom capability.
