## Course Description:

This course provides a framework through which students pursue their photographic practice at an advanced level. A series of three thematic assignments in Winter Term 1 lead into independent research and the development of a significant final project in Winter Term 2. Students demonstrate independent research through the compilation and presentation of a unique visual source binder. Assigned readings inform the thematic assignments as well as provide motivation for the production of a final project that is content-driven and expresses personal artistic vision. By the end of this course, students should be able to situate their work within a critical discourse of contemporary photography.
