Teaching Philosophy

I seek to foster: 1) *A Participatory Learning Community*—students develop classroom community guidelines, take part in informal and formal group work, and take responsibility as learners and knowledge producers; 2) *Critical Thinking and Professional Communication Skills*—I utilize a variety of assignments and exercises that aid in the development of skills in analysis, synthesis, reading, writing, and communicating orally and digitally; 3) *Intellectual Inquiry*—I model, and provide opportunities for, the process of learning as the cultivation of curiosity; and 4) *Community Engagement* –my upper level courses typically include assignments in which students conduct research on community initiatives and/or disseminate research publicly.

Accomplishments

All three of the IGS MA students that I have supervised – Lindsay Balfour, Carrie Karsgaard, and Lindsay Diehl – have received the prestigious SSHRC Canada Graduate Scholarship for their doctoral studies. My TEQ scores for teaching are consistently above 4.5 in the “very good teacher” category in courses at all levels. This is noteworthy because the courses I teach focus on themes and content that are challenging to students (anti-racism, colonialism, violence, etc.) and the pedagogical approach and assignments require significant student engagement.

In addition to my FCCS award for teaching excellence (2014), I was nominated for this same award in 2018, specifically for my teaching in first and second-year courses.

Impact of Scholarship

I have published one monograph with the University of Toronto Press, a co-edited book with Duke University Press, and more than twenty peer-reviewed articles and chapters. Based on the statistics of Google Scholar – which is a limited source but the best available to humanities scholars – my book, *Postcolonial Resistance*, and many of my articles have been widely cited by scholars around the world and in a variety of disciplines, including development studies, education, literary studies, international relations, management, and marketing. As a result of my recent research on global citizenship and humanitarianism, I have developed scholarly relationships with colleagues both in Canada and overseas, including invitations to present and publish my research, invitations to participate in international collaborative research projects, invitations to serve on the editorial and international advisory boards for international journals, and invitations to provide keynote presentations.

Current Research

My current research focuses on two distinct projects:

1. *Humanitarian Discourse* – I am working on a monograph manuscript focusing on discourses of humanitarianism and I have published more than 10 articles and chapters in this area, including an edited a collection focused on humanitarianism, race, and theories of ‘post-racialism’, published in the journal, *Critical Race and Critical Whiteness Studies*, in March 2015.
2. *Settler Colonial Heritage Practices* – This research focuses on the construction of place and settler identities through heritage and other practices of public memory. This project has developed out of the community-based project AlterKnowledge, as well as collaborations with the Ki-Low-Na Friendship Society and the supervision of student research with the Scenewips Heritage Museum and the Kelowna Museums Society.
