This course will explore how knowledge is constructed and communicated in the social sciences to both specialist and non-specialist audiences. It begins from the premise that research in the social sciences must be communicated effectively to have real impact. Over the course of the semester, students will be encouraged to develop their intermediate-level written, verbal, oral and digital communication skills through self-determined project-based work. The course will advance students' understandings of the broader conversations, challenges, and persuasive elements that ground communicative choices in academic and professional contexts, including choices related to research data, ethics, and methodologies.
