



CORH 304 (3 credits): Persuasive Rhetoric, Public Speaking, and Advocacy

Many people fear public speaking, but it is a vital skill in most workplaces and professional contexts. This course delves into the history of rhetoric in public speaking using multimodal platforms (audio, visual, textual, and digital), and historical as well as current contexts and resources. Students will build on their existing skills in public speaking and learn to communicate assertively, persuasively, and ethically within diverse professional and community settings. Recommended prerequisite: THTR 104. Prerequisite: Third-year standing or permission of the instructor.
