Drawing from a diverse range of literary, film and theoretical material, this course introduces students to the history, culture and literary traditions of various Francophone contexts, including Sub-Saharan Africa (e.g. Senegal, Rwanda), North Africa (e.g. Tunisia, Algeria), the Indian Ocean (e.g. Comoros, Madagascar), the Caribbean (e.g. Guadeloupe, Martinique), Asia (e.g. Pondicherry). Students can expect to 1) hone their close-reading and interpretive skills; 2) discuss literary texts in French, with particular attention to the complexities of comparing texts from different cultural and linguistic contexts; 3) relate creative material to contemporary public debates, such as #MeToo and Black Lives Matter.
